At the center of Catholic moral teaching is the belief that conscience provides us a unique ability to discern right and wrong. Rooted in the tenet of faith that we are made in the image and likeness of God, “the voice of conscience can, when necessary, speak to our heart...” (Catholic Catechism)

During a morning session with Dr. Charles Curran and an afternoon session with Sr. Jeannine Gramick SL, we will explore the tension created when our moral compass leads to a place different from traditional Church teaching. We will hear about their journeys of conscience and its impact on the Church community.

Dr. Charles Curran:

Charles Curran is retiring Elizabeth Scurlock Professor of Human Values at Southern Methodist University and is an expert on fundamental moral theology, social ethics, and Catholic moral theology. He is author of numerous books and articles including *Catholic Moral Theology in the United States: A History* (2008) and *Loyal Dissent: Memoir of a Catholic Theologian* (2006)

Sister Jeannine Gramick, SL:

To a 1999 Vatican order to cease her 30 year ministry for lesbian/gay persons, Sister Jeannine Gramick responded, “I choose not to collaborate in my own oppression” and continues her advocacy today. Her story is documented in the film, *In Good Conscience: Sister Jeannine Gramick’s Journey of Faith*.
